



Taiwan was listed as 1 of 4 "super innovators" along with Germany, Switzerland and the USA according to the 2019 WEF's "Global Competitiveness Report" and ranked 7th in the IMD world competitiveness rankings 2022. Studying in Taiwan

Taiwan's Education System

In Taiwan, students can pursue higher education at 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities. Undergraduate program usually require 4 years of study, while master's degrees require 1 to 4 years, and doctoral programs require 2 to 7 years. In most institutions of higher education, the academic year begins in August or September and ends in July the following year. The academic year is divided into two semesters: the first semester from August usually to the following January, and the second semester beginning in February and ending in July.




