About TEEP

In 2015, the Taiwanese Ministry of Education launched a new program called "Taiwan Experience Education Program (TEEP)," said program's purpose being to welcome international students to join different universities and colleges in Taiwan for short term professional internship. Via TEEP Fellowship, qualified international students can now experience in-depth education in Taiwan, thereby facilitating their integration within the Asian job market.

Internship + Chinese

By joining the internship program, students from all majors have opportunity to learn about the companies (or industries), their developments and experience their international business operations. Moreover, by undertaking various job placements according to their specialties, the students themselves are expected to participate in the activities of various company departments, thereby acquiring firsthand knowledge vital for an early access to the business world. In addition to internship, the learning of Chinese language, cultural immersion and high quality dormitory service are also included. The cultural immersion program is designed to facilitate internship students' understanding of Chinese language and Taiwanese culture, so as to allow a smoother adaptation in Taiwan during their internship period.

Feng Chia Green Life Summer School

Feng Chia University (FCU)



The Green Life Summer School program's first and foremost objective is teaching students to live a "green life," one involving comprehensive knowledge of renewable energy technology, low-carbon imprint and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). Innovative green technologies such as bioenergy production, microbial fuel cell, solar energy, nanotechnology and micro hydropower are all expected to be introduced and practiced during the program, as are the societal impacts of green energy and social enterprise (primarily through lectures).

A lecture on low-carbon life will take place at some point during the program, offering participants a detailed analysis of their own daily carbon dioxide emission, as well as more recreational, but no less practical activities through the "Taiwan carbon imprint monopoly." Two field trips will be organized for better observation and understanding of bioenergy, solar energy and wind power energy plants in Taiwan.

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Crouching Tigers – Cultivating Taiwan's International Business Employees in the Emerging Markets

National Cheng Kung University (NCKU)



Working with Taiwanese international companies, The Institute of International Management (hereinafter referred to as "IIMBA") recruits talented international youths from emerging and developed countries for short-term studies in Taiwan. There are three sessions options in total. The first session is a two-week program in May-Jun, the second session is a two-week program in Sep-Oct, and the last session is a four-week program in Jul-Aug. Said programs include seminars, which are delivered by executives and top-ranked managers from Taiwanese international companies. Participants will be expected to solve several business problems raised by these managers during the seminars. Field trips and culture-experiencing tours are also included. Depending on their performance during the programs, participants may receive internship or job offers from our sponsoring firms.



During internship period, costs of accommodation, tuition and field trips are entirely covered. Selected participants are however responsible for travel expenses, insurance premium and living expenses. Depending on the internship or job offer contract, the expenses may vary. Applications start on Feb. 15, 2016.

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A Journey through Eastern Medicine and Culture – an International Student Exchange Program

China Medical University (CMU)



China Medical University (hereafter 'CMU') plans to invite partner universities and those affiliated with Central Taiwan Teaching Learning Resource Center to participate and contribute to the project called "A Journey through Eastern Medicine and Culture – an International Student Exchange Program." This project will include introductions to Taiwanese culture, Chinese medicine and Taiwanese health services, followed by relevant lectures along with visits to hospitals, public health departments, Chinese herbal drug manufacturers and cultural tours on famous spots. The aim of all above learning contents is to attract international students from allied sister universities to join the project's programs.

Each foreign participant shall be assigned with one or two CMU or partner universities students as study fellows for an exchange of cultural views. Moreover, abundant interchanges are expected after class, on matters such as local culture, history and delicacies, all of which are expected to enrich the knowledge of students, both international and local. Indeed, one of the ultimate goals of this project lies in a significant increase in self-confidence when it comes to language proficiency and communication skills, which are vital for both Taiwanese and international students in the age of globalization.

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Experiencing Tainan – English Summer Camp & Global Internship in English Teaching

Southern Taiwan University of Science and Technology (STUST)

Drawing inspiration from the successful implementation of the 2015 TEEP program by STUST and its proven module design, the 2016 version intends to expand and diversify its international exchange program in a more profound and innovative way. The 2016 program essentially embraces three phases of learning and internship. Its first phase mainly involves the implementation of the 2016 Experiencing Tainan English Summer Camp, thereby highlighting the participants' multi-faceted immersion into life in Tainan, Taiwan's cultural capital. In the second and third phases, foreign students are assigned to six featured elementary schools for intensive English teaching internship. All six schools are well known for their English learning environment establishment and prominent English teaching module design. The effects of the 2016 TEEP program @STUST are expected to spread across academic levels and governmental sectors, which constitutes a win-win scenario for all stakeholders involved.

The **“Transnational Network for Critical Inter-Asia Cultural Studies Workshop”** fosters research collaboration with international partner institutes by promoting student exchange, organizing distinguished scholar lecture series, and publicizing the TEEP project via the aforementioned and other relevant events.

The **International Winter Camp**, jointly undertaken by multiple UST member universities, is focused on the theme “Decoding the Cold War the Facing Contemporary Societies” in 2016. The goal of this particular event is to discuss shared experiences in the East Asian region. With lectures by world-class scholars and local field trips, the event is a small-scale program designed for 20-40 graduate or PhD students. Applications can be submitted from all around the globe, and particularly from East Asian countries.

Short-term Field Trip Studies is an internship program that offers international exchange students opportunities for a 2 to 4-month stay in Taiwan. Along with short term courses, independent-study supervision, research resources, and chances of local field trips, successful applicants to the program can expect access to various UST-affiliated institutes, including Taiwan Film Institute, multiple art galleries, museums, community-based organizations, Social Movement organizers, NGOs, print and Internet media.

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Taiwan Nature Treasure Map Program

National Taiwan University (NTU)



The “Taiwan Nature Treasure Map Program,” developed by the National Taiwan University School of Forestry and Conservation, encourages international students to explore the beauty of Taiwan from cultural and natural perspectives. This program provides a paid internship opportunity for international students. Students will stay at a selected site for one month, during which co-working with local rangers and hands-on experiences are expected to play an important role. Additionally, students are allowed to spend their time exploring local nature and aboriginal culture.

Students do not need to pay fees; instead, they will receive an NTD 15,000 (around USD 450) scholarship per month. The program also provides free accommodation at internship sites. There are several internship sites for students to choose from. An orientation and a closing ceremony shall take place at the end of the internship. Know that by applying for the program, the student must undertake several responsibilities: working with local rangers (including review of English documentation, interpretation, natural/cultural resources investigation and so forth; less than 3 hours per day), making weekly observation records (text, image or video clip) of his/her Taiwan cultural or natural experience (published on Facebook and the program website) and creating a Nature Treasure Map (treasure map = pirates) of the internship site at the end of the program.

International Consulting Program in Taiwan

National Sun Yat-sen University (NSYSU)

This summer, the National Sun Yat-sen University offers you a chance to learn more about Taiwanese companies. Come and extend your knowledge of Taiwanese culture and get a chance to be part of a consulting team for a leading company in Taiwan!

What this program offers is a 2 months consulting process, during which professional consultants will accompany the students' work on a case involving important clients such as well-known enterprises. Upon completion of the program, successful participants will have an opportunity to stay and work for the company they had internship with.

For better enjoyment of their leisure time, three scenic trips will be organized for the students.

Language classes are also available, thereby providing students with an opportunity to improve their Chinese. A test will be taken in order to determine the students' Chinese proficiency. They will then be split into different levels for specific training. Chinese proficiency is arguably a huge headstart for any foreign student wishing to work in Asia.

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Summer Research Internship Program

National Tsing Hua University (NTHU)

Our Summer Research Internship Program (hereafter 'SRIP'), available for both undergraduate and graduate students, aims to provide exclusive opportunities for international students majoring in EE or CS to work in top laboratories, while experiencing the rich local culture.



Taiwan is the global base of semiconductor manufacturing and IC design. It is the home to more than half of the top 100 ICT companies in Asia. Holding a central position in the intersection between Asia and the Pacific Rim, Taiwan also serves as a gateway into Asia. National Tsing Hua University occupies a strategic position in Taiwan. Indeed, it is adjacent to the Hsinchu Science Park, which is the primary R&D base for many high-tech industries in Taiwan. The College of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science at NTHU conducts world-class research and collaborates closely with relevant industries by establishing many joint research centers and labs.

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Meet Your Possibilities in Taiwan: Culture, Academics, Industry

National Tsing Hua University (NTHU)

With the Vision on Research Excellence and Technological Innovation program, the National Tsing Hua University College of Engineering aims to fully develop the candidates' potential, allowing them to become creative and innovative leaders in the global society. This program welcomes all university students, both undergraduates and graduates, from all around the globe, thereby offering a great opportunity for the mixture of cultural experiences, academic achievements, and social outings. A student can select a research internship from this program.

A research internship is a two-month research experience under the guidance of a faculty advisor from the College of Engineering. Each participant will work collaboratively with their mentors on an ongoing research project or a new project of mutual interest.

A limited number of Global Engineer Leadership (GEL) scholarships include subsidized round trip airline tickets up to NTD 15,000 and free nine-week accommodation at the university residence hall. This program also arranges a scenic trip around Taiwan. Join us, and meet fellow participants from all around the world!

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
